Aims and scope

After the introduction of the acronym CSCW (Computer Supported Cooperative Work) in the late 80' the themes connected with the understanding of how collaboration is managed in different work settings and with the design of the information and communication technologies supporting collaboration have become pervasive in many scientific, business and social discourses. The constant growth of the application domains where the CSCW themes can inform both social studies and technology design requires a continuous elaboration of the theoretical *foundations* of the underpinning disciplines through a reflection on the outcomes of the several *field studies*, of the *methods* applied in the social and technological investigations and of the impact of the *technologies* on the settings in which they are deployed. The combination of these three perspectives should be the patrimony of any researcher who wants to grasp the complex and subtle issues that are involved in the CSCW research area. The course will present central themes, methods and discussions within CSCW by experienced scholars in conversations with participants.
